Supr. Marshall opened the meeting with roll call and the Pledge of Allegiance.

TOWN BOARD MINUTES

On a motion by Councilman Arndt and seconded by Councilwoman Welch the minutes of the December 10, 2012 Town Board Meeting; and the minutes of the December 29, 2012 Year-End Town Board meeting were ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: Marshall, Welch, Arndt, Storm and Bachman.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

No one signed up for privilege of the floor.

Supr. Marshall mentioned that in the last couple of weeks we have lost two good people that did much for the Town of South Bristol. Gary Muxworthy, who was a Town Board member, passed away on December 31st. Earlier this week, Joe Polimeni passed away and was a member on the South Bristol ZBA and BAR. Supr. Marshall noted that he has two resolutions of sympathy.

On a motion made by Councilman Arndt and seconded by Councilman Storm, Resolution No. 20-2013 was ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: Marshall, Welch, Arndt, Storm and Bachman.

RESOLVED, that this resolution be made a part of the minutes of this Board and a copy presented to his family.

DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS: CEO REPORT

Supr. Marshall noted that ZBA Secretary Debbie Minutes submitted a noted stating that all Zoning Board of Appeals Board members met their training requirements.

On a motion made by Councilman Arndt and seconded by Councilwoman Storm the 2012 Year-End CEO Report was ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: Marshall, Welch, Arndt, Storm and Bachman.

Councilman Arndt noted that there will be a Fireworks display on January 26th at Bristol Harbor by Young Explosives. Supr. Marshall noted asked Clerk Hanley to notify the residents at Bristol Harbor.

Councilman Bachman asked if the Board was going to talk about fees tonight? This is another example of 5 days notice, the Bristol Harbor residents will get this information tomorrow and will need to make plans for something that is days from now. Councilman Bachman said that this coincides with his request to have a 30-day notice. If the Town doesn't get 30 days notice, then no fireworks permit is issued.

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Supr. Marshall noted that the Board will discuss the fees on a broader scale in the next month or two; all the Town's fees. Councilman Arndt noted that the Board had discussed this but didn't make a determination. Councilman Bachman said this is why he made the suggestion.

ASSESSOR'S REPORT

Supr. Marshall noted that the Assessor has submitted a report as well as an addendum to the report.

On a motion made by Councilman Bachman to accept the Assessor's report seconded by Councilman Storm was ACCPETED. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: Marshall, Welch, Arndt, Storm and Bachman.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: HIGHWAY DEPT.

Councilman Arndt noted that the Highway Dept. is working on tree-trimming on Seneca Point Road. The rest of the work is typical winter repair work.

Councilman Arndt noted that the Town of Victor had stored 1100 tons of salt in the Town Salt Barn and South Bristol has since used that salt. The 1100 tons was recently drop-shipped off to the Town of Victor and there is a voucher in the abstract that reflects this so the Board is aware. The Highway Dept. is within 200 tons of its contractual obligation for salt. The contract requires the Town to purchase 80% of its agreement.

Councilman Arndt continued, noting that new windows have been installed over at the Highway Dept. as well as the installation of a dropped ceiling in the break room and office.

Councilman Arndt noted that Supt. Wight did some analysis on propane prices for the Town. Amerigas was the lowest at \$2.39. Supt. Wight noted that the price is \$1.49.

Councilman Arndt continued, that the Grater has been sandblasted and painted and the blade extended; part of the winter work.

Councilman Arndt noted that the Loader purchased last year has accumulated 189 hours. The Board decided that the Loader would be on a two-year trade in rotation; that decision can be made at the end of the year.

Councilman Arndt noted that Supt. Wight has been talking with Suit-Kote, the oil supplier. Councilman Arndt noted that the Highway Dept. will be working on Gulick Road this summer. Gulick Road is 6.7 miles of Town roadway; double that up for 2 lanes. The plan is to increase the road bed by 1.5 feet per side and would like to have all of Gulick Road done; if not, the Highway Dept. will only do half. Councilman Arndt noted that there is CHIPS money from 2012 still available as well as 2013 CHIPS money; totaling around \$130,000.00 for the project. Councilman Arndt will put Gulick Road on rotation with all the other Town roads, every 3-4 years, for repair. After the work, Gulick Road should be close to County specs. If it is cost prohibitive only half of the roadway will be completed.

Councilman Arndt noted that the new truck is not in yet. We are not trading in a truck but keeping the best of the fleet for mutual aid with other Towns. If we do this and put the trucks on rotation, we should be able to have a 4-5 year rotation instead of having to buy 2 trucks in one year which would kill the budget.

Councilman Arndt continued, noting that Supt. Wight would like to take down the Quonset hut down that is on the north-side of the Transfer Station and add a 2-bay garage at some point.

Supr. Marshall asked what equipment would go in the 2-bay garage, the loader and another vehicle? Supt. Wight agreed, the Loader also gets put inside during the winter months.

Councilwoman Welch asked if we are keeping track of the hours of all the equipment now? Supr. Marshall noted the service logs would kep track of the hours on the equipment. Supt. Wight noted that there is an hour meter on everything. Councilwoman Welch asked if the yearly totals were figured? Supt. Wight agreed, the hours are recorded when the equipment is serviced and there are mileage and fuel logs as well.

Supr. Marshall asked the reasoning behind keeping a truck for mutual aid. Councilman Arndt said that the dump truck we are keeping is worth a lot of money and if we do have a mutual aid agreement and one of the trucks and an employee are out it doesn't jeopardize the whole crew. Supt. Wight agreed and said that the "old" truck is the truck that had its box body replaced that was purchased recently. The Board had discussed the reason behind having 4 trucks, instead of 3 because he needs to be able to send a truck and employee out for mutual aid and still get the work done for the Town. The plan is to have 4 trucks and when it comes time to replace a truck, the old truck will go to auction; we are not just going to be adding to the fleet.

Councilwoman Welch asked if the 4th truck will be used solely for mutual aid. Supt. Wight said no, it will serve the Town.

BUILDINGS & GROUNDS, CEMETERIES

Councilman Storm had nothing to report. Supr. Marshall noted that the roof of the Town Hall is still leaking and the sooner we consider a roof replacement the better. Councilwoman Welch asked if we have someone to replace the roof. Supr. Marshall noted that the quotes received were for budget purposes only. The Board will have to put out a form request for quotes. Councilwoman Welch noted that one of the roofers that submitted a quote does work year round and wouldn't have to wait until spring. Councilman Arndt asked if the Board had decided on standard shingles or standing-seam? Councilman Storm said the standard shingles. Supr. Marshall noted that we decided on standard shingle but you can have a metal roof without the standard seam; he would like a roof that lasts. Councilman Arndt agreed. Supr. Marshall noted that the roof has a small pitch to it and not sure that is an issue. Councilman Arndt said if you applied ice and water shied on the whole roof with a 30-year architectural shingle it should last. The issue is the cupola on the roof and didn't know who put it up there or how. Supr. Marshall agreed and noted that the contractor that has tried to repair the leak has said that the cupola is the problem and recommended removing it. Supr. Marshall noted that BOCES students had designed built and placed the cupola on the roof and doesn't know if it was properly flashed. Supr. Marshall asked the Board if they wished to begin the bid process for the roof replacement. Councilman Arndt defined the bid as a 35-year architectural shingle, ice and water shield throughout, with or without a cupola and tear-off. Councilman Storm noted that the quotes received for budget purposes did not include a 35-year shingle. Supr. Marshall noted that next month, the Board will decide which course to take.

PERSONNEL, HANDBOOK PROCEDURES

Councilwoman Welch had nothing to report.

PUBLIC SAFETY & COMMUNITY RELATIONS

Councilman Bachman noted that 175th Celebration Committee meets again this week. The March 9th Open House is a Saturday from 9am – Noon, Town officials should be present.

Supr. Marshall agreed and will take care the Town employees; the CEO and Assessor should be available and the Tax Collector will be here. Supr. Marshall asked the Committee to invite the Town Justices. Councilman Bachman said that it is the kick-off to the 2013 birthday celebration for the Town.

Councilman Bachman said that the CD tickets for the Transfer Station are now available and spoke with one of the new employees about the process; they are conveying the message but have nothing to enforce. Councilman Bachman said that he would like Supt. Wight to help implement the new regulations. Councilman Bachman said that he would get the information together and plan on spending the whole day at the Transfer Station this Saturday. Supt. Wight agreed and said that it will be a learning curve for the residents.

POLICY - INSURANCE, HANDBOOK, PROCEDURES

Councilwoman Welch wanted to talk to the Board about Additional Insured Certificates; it is probably the greatest tool any organization has to protect itself from negligence or gross negligence. What it does is any organization or corporation that provides a service to the Town of South Bristol, at a charge and under contract such as roofing or fire protection, or an agreement or anyone that uses the Town Hall, such as the Historical Society, needs to provide to the Town of South Bristol a certificate of insurance indicating that they have contacted their insurance carrier and that the Town of South Bristol has been added to their policy. What that does for the Town of South Bristol, if there is some gross negligence, if we hire a roofer with an employee that has a drug and alcohol problem that they are aware of and backs someone over in the parking lot. If the Town doesn't get insurance certificate the Town will have to sue the contractor and the injured party can sue the Town and the Town's insurance as well. Councilwoman Welch continued, now what will happen with the insurance certificate is the contractor's insurance will become the primary insurance; their insurance carrier will defend the Town against a lawsuit for negligence. Under municipal law it has to be gross negligence; there is a higher standard that municipalities have to reach. In the case of the Naples ire Dept. that is a municipal contract; in the past we have added "hold harmless" to the Fire Contracts. Councilwoman Welch noted that the greatest protection the Town could have is by telling the fire departments that we want additional insured status or certificate issued. This affects a lot of our relationships; namely the 4 fire departments that we take taxpayer money and a contract in place. It affects the South Bristol Historical Society and Councilwoman Welch noted that she has spoken with the President and is on board with that.

On a motion made by Councilwoman Welch request that the Town of South Bristol be placed as additional insured on General Liability and Vehicle Insurance Policies for the 4 fire districts and the South Bristol Historical Society and when we go out to bid on the roofing that we specify a required and Additional Named Insured Certificate and not enter into any contracts with these parties until that language is included in the contract for the current year and seconded by Councilman Arndt was ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: 4. Voting NAY: 1. Voting AYE: Marshall, Welch, Arndt and Bachman. Voting NAY: Storm.

Discussion:

Supr. Marshall noted that, in the past, we have written the fire contracts. Councilwoman Welch noted that she will ask Joel Steele for the wording to be added to the fire contracts; and there is not a contract with the South Bristol Historical Society for usage of the building. Councilwoman Welch noted that the Historical Society has said they would get an insurance certificate to the Town.

Supr. Marshall noted that up until recently the Historical Society seldomly used the Town Hall; are we going to ask everyone to uses the Town Hall for an insurance certificate? Councilwoman Welch said that is a separate discussion; we've had that discussion in the past of the usage of the building by third parties and have chosen not to develop a contract for usage. Councilwoman Welch said that the Ontario Co. Republican Committee, the Red Cross, Historical Society have all used the building at times.

Supr. Marshall noted that if Ontario Co. Planning Dept. wants to use the Town Hall, as well as the Fingerlakes Visiting Center, one time, that's all. Do we really need to call them out on that? Councilwoman Welch said probably, we have no control over who is negligent and who is not. Our insurance carrier will give us a additional insured certificate with no additional premium, no extra cost. It is a lot simpler than it sounds; the range is \$0 -\$135 per year for liability insurance. The insurance company wants to know who is coming in to use the Town Hall; they want to make sure you don't have someone coming in and serving alcohol; and we have no control over accidents.

Councilman Bachman asked if someone came in on a Friday and wanted to use the building on Saturday, this is a public building. Supr. Marshall agreed and said the building should be available for the South Bristol residents. Supr. Marshall understood the reasoning for protection, but having a quilting group use the building; they are not an organization and are not going to have an insurance policy and do not want to tell them they can't use the facility; can't the current insurance have some coverage for that?

Councilwoman Welch said that the Town does have coverage for that; but you don't want to assume coverage where you don't have to. This is a vehicle where you do not assume the risk for other people's negligence, gross negligence. Things happen; this protects the taxpayers of South Bristol.

Kevin Murphy said that the Town does have insurance if he met with 12 people at the Town Hall and someone fell and broke their leg; organizations are the issue. Councilwoman Welch agreed. Mr. Murphy said the atmosphere is licentious; everyone covering their backside.

Councilman Arndt said that Councilwoman Welch had mentioned the 4 fire departments, the mutual aid and has made the motion to include all that. Councilman Arndt suggested tabling the issue until we see what the language sounds like, etc.

John McAlpin said that Monroe County Water Authority set the standard on additional named insured. There is a difference between *additional insured* and *additional named insured*. Additional named insured, the contractor who is doing work for you literally has you named in their contract which means their policy not only coverage, but defense; so additional named insured is appropriate. Monroe County Water Authority did not want to assume the financial risk of any contractor going out and doing the digging for them; Monroe County Water Authority was relying on their insurance and their insurance was inadequate. This is to reduce costs; going so far as having a public organization having to file an insurance certificate is a bit much. Supr. Marshall agreed.

Supr. Marshall noted that everything Councilwoman Welch has said has merit, but there is a line there. Councilwoman Welch agreed and said that she was relying on the insurance broker, he did recommend, particularly since we are having the Historical Society meeting here, as additional insured under their coverage.

Edgar Brown, President of the South Bristol Historical Society, noted that one of the considerations should be frequency of use. Councilwoman Welch didn't have that information.

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Supr. Marshall noted that the event scheduled in March for the 175th Open House; is that a Town event or a Historical society event? Councilman Bachman said that all the events have been described as being Historical Society events.

Supr. Marshall noted that it seems like an easy fix and given the events scheduled it would be appropriate. Councilwoman Welch agreed.

Councilman Arndt summated, we will get the insurance certificate from the fire departments and every contractor does this as a matter of course, anyways; the Historical Society will submit their insurance for this year. Councilwoman Welch agreed and said that mutual aid is another area.

Councilman Storm asked if someone comes in to work on the Town Hall they have to submit insurance; someone had come and fixed some siding and asked if we need to get their insurance too? Councilman Arndt said to ask Mr. Steele. Councilwoman Welch agreed.

ENVIRONMENTAL

Supr. Marshall noted that he had nothing on Environmental.

LEGAL

Supr. Marshall noted that he has been trying to find out what the status is on the final decisions with regards to the lawsuits for assessment grievances; they are still pending.

OLD BUSINESS RESOLUTIONI – ADOPTION OF LOCAL LAW EXTENDING MORATORIUM ON HYDRO-FRACKING

Supr. Marshall that Public Hearings were held tonight and asked the Board is they had anything to discuss? Councilman Arndt and Councilwoman Welch said to move forward. Supr. Marshall noted that the Board has a Resolution to Adopt the Local Law in front of them for their approval.

On a motion made by Councilwoman Welch to adopt Local Law #1-2013 Establishing a Second Moratorium on Horizontal and Directional Gas Drilling and Hydraulic Fracturing Uses and seconded by Councilman Storm was ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: Marshall, Welch, Arndt, Storm and Bachman.

RESOLUTION NO. 22-2013

A local law "Establishing a Second Moratorium on Horizontal and Directional Gas Drilling and Hydraulic Fracturing Uses"

Section 1. TITLE:

This Local Law shall be known as the "Moratorium on Horizontal and Directional Gas Drilling and Hydraulic Fracturing".

Section 2. STATEMENT OF LEGISLATIVE INTENT:

January 14, 2013

It is the purpose of this local law to prevent serious detrimental health and environmental effects posed by the practices of horizontal or directional gas drilling and hydraulic fracturing, also known as hydro-fracking, which could threaten the Town of South Bristol through potential contamination of aquifers and fresh water supply, the use of massive quantities of water, the disposal of the fracking fluids, the release of chemicals used in the processes and the impact upon local landscapes which could result in the degradation of the Town of South Bristol's significant environmental, natural, aesthetic and agricultural resources as well as to the Town of South Bristol's infrastructure. It is the further purpose of this local law to enable the Town of South Bristol to have sufficient time to research its ability to enact regulations pertaining to the practices of horizontal or directional gas drilling and hydraulic fracturing and to enact a local law enacting such regulations within the Town of South Bristol.

The Town of South Bristol established a one-year moratorium on the review, approval or creation of any new wells, projects or businesses involving the practices of horizontal or directional drilling or hydraulic fracturing (hydro-fracking) effective January 31, 2012 with the filing of Local Law No. 1 of 2012 with the New York State Department of State. After consideration of the scope of the review and possible revisions to the Town Code, the Town Board deems it necessary to adopt a second six (6)-month moratorium on these specified operations.

Section 3. DEFINITIONS

- A. HORIZONTAL OR DIRECTIONAL DRILLING The practice of digging a well, first, down vertically to a depth above the target gas-bearing rock formation, then, on a curve so that the hole is drilled horizontally or at an angle within the gas-bearing rock.
- B. HYDRAULIC FRACTURING OR HYDRO-FRACKING The practice of pumping a fluid and a propping material, typically composed of sand or other chemicals, down a well under high pressure to create fractures in gas-bearing rock.
- C. TOWN: Town of South Bristol, Ontario County, New York
 TOWN BOARD: Town of South Bristol Town Board
 PLANNING BOARD: Town of South Bristol Planning Board
 BUILDING INSPECTOR: Town of South Bristol Building Inspector

Section 4. MORATORIUM.

- A. The Town Board hereby enacts a second moratorium which shall prohibit the review, approval or creation anywhere within the Town of any new wells, projects or businesses involving the practices of horizontal or directional drilling or hydraulic fracturing (hydrofracking), or the disposal, storage, or dumping of waste, contaminated or otherwise, or other waste by-products created by the practices of horizontal or directional drilling or hydraulic fracturing (hydro-fracking).
- B. This second moratorium shall be in effect for a period of six (6) months from the effective date of this Local Law and shall expire on the earlier of (i) the date six (6) months from said effective date, unless renewed; or (ii) the enactment by the Town Board of a resolution indicating the Town Board is satisfied that the need for the moratorium no longer exists.
 - C. This moratorium shall apply to all real property within the Town.
- D. Pursuant to this moratorium, the Planning Board shall not review any applications for any new wells, projects or businesses within the Town involving the practices of horizontal or directional drilling or hydraulic fracturing (hydro-fracking) and shall not grant any preliminary or final site plan approval to any property on which is intended to have on it any

well, project or business involving the practices of horizontal or directional drilling or hydraulic fracturing (hydro-fracking), or the disposal, storage, or dumping of waste, contaminated or otherwise, or other waste by-products created by the practices of horizontal or directional drilling or hydraulic fracturing (hydro-fracking).

- E. Pursuant to this moratorium, the Building Inspector shall not issue Building Permits for the construction of any well involving the practices of horizontal or directional drilling or hydraulic fracturing (hydro-fracking), or facilities for the disposal, storage, or dumping of waste, contaminated or otherwise, or other waste by-products created by the practices of horizontal or directional drilling or hydraulic fracturing (hydro-fracking) anywhere within the Town.
- F. Pursuant to this moratorium, no applications for variances, special use permits or other approvals involving any new wells, projects or businesses involving the practices of horizontal or directional drilling or hydraulic fracturing (hydro-fracking), or facilities for the disposal, storage, or dumping of waste, contaminated or otherwise, or other waste by-products created by the practices of horizontal or directional drilling or hydraulic fracturing (hydro-fracking) anywhere within the Town shall be processed or granted.

Section 5. PENALTIES.

Any person, firm, entity or corporation which shall violate the provisions of this Local Law, shall be subject to:

- 1. A penalty in the amount of a minimum of \$100.00 and a maximum of \$250.00 for each day that such violation shall exist; and
- 2. Injunctive relief in favor of the Town to cease any and all such actions which conflict with this Local Law and, if necessary, to remove any construction or improvements which may have been built in violation of this Local Law.

It shall be the duty of the Building Inspector to enforce the provisions of this Local Law. Section 6. VALIDITY.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been ordered.

Section 7. SUPERSEDING EFFECT.

Pursuant to New York Municipal Home Rule Law, Section 22, the provisions of this law are to supersede any inconsistent provision of state or local law.

Section 8. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the New York Department of State and shall remain in force and effect for a period of six (6) months from the date of such filing.

A Local Law to Amend Chapter 146 (Solid Waste and Recycling) of the Code of the Town of South Bristol

Section 1: The definitions of "Director" and "Recyclable, Reusable or Other Components" contained in Section 146-2 of Chapter 146 (Solid Waste and Recycling) of the Code of the Town of South Bristol are hereby amended so that they are hereafter defined as follows:

DIRECTOR – The person whom the Town Board appoints to oversee, direct and manage Solid Waste and Recycling with the Town.

RECYCLABLE, REUSABLE OR OTHER COMPONENTS – Paper, glass, metals, plastics, garden and yard waste and such other elements of solid waste as may be designated by the Director at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of said designation and published

once in the official newspaper(s) of the Town of South Bristol, and further provided that such material is not hazardous and can be reasonably separated from the solid water stream and held for material recycling or reuse value.

Section 2: Section 146-2 of Chapter 146 (Solid Waste and Recycling) of the Code of the Town of South Bristol is hereby amended by adding the following definitions:

OWNER – A person, corporation, limited liability company, partnership or other legal entity owning real property within the Town of South Bristol.

RESIDENT – A person who physically lives and resides in the Town of South Bristol, regardless of whether such person owns or rents such residence.

TRANSFER AND RECYCLING FACILITY – A facility that the Town of South Bristol owns and operates for the purpose of collecting Solid Waste, Yard Waste and Recyclable, Reusable or Other Components.

Section 3. Chapter 146 (Solid Waste and Recycling) of the Code of the Town of South Bristol is hereby amended by adding a new section 146-7.1 to read as follows:

§ 146-7.1. Transfer and recycling facility operations.

- A. The Director shall oversee, direct and manage the operation of the Transfer and Recycling Facility to include the personnel, hours of operations, rules and regulation of intake of Solid Waste, Yard Waste and Recyclable, Reusable or Other Components, and proper transfer to an authorized and approved Solid Waste Management Facility, all subject to Town Board approval. The Director, and/or his agents and employees, shall have the discretion and authority to refuse acceptance of any Solid Waste, Yard Waste or Recyclable, Reusable or Other Components to the Transfer and Recycling Facility.
- B. The Transfer and Recycling Facility shall be for the exclusive use by Residents and Owners, as such terms are defined in this chapter.
- C. A Resident is permitted to convey, deposit, discard, dump or dispose of any Solid Waste, Yard Waste or Recyclable, Reusable or Other Components that is generated only from the real property within the Town of South Bristol that such Resident claims as his or her residence.
- D. An Owner is permitted to convey, deposit, discard, dump or dispose of any Solid Waste, Yard Waste or Recyclable, Reusable or Other Components that is generated only from such real property in the Town of South Bristol that such Owner owns.
- E. It shall be unlawful for any person, corporation, limited liability company, partnership or other legal entity, other than a Resident or Owner, as defined in this chapter, to utilize the Transfer and Recycling Facility for the conveyance, depositing, discarding, dumping or disposal of any Solid Waste, Yard Waste or Recyclable, Reusable or Other Components.
- F. It shall be unlawful for a Resident or Owner, as defined in this chapter, to utilize the Transfer and Recycling Facility for the conveyance, depositing, discarding, dumping or disposal of any Solid Waste, Yard Waste or Recyclable, Reusable or Other Components other than as permitted by this Chapter.
- Section 4: Section 146-10 of Chapter 146 (Solid Waste and Recycling) of the Code of the Town of South Bristol is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - § 146-10. Penalties for offenses.
 - 1. Any person, corporation, limited liability company, partnership or other legal entity who or which shall violate any of the provisions of this Chapter shall be guilty of a violation.
 - 2. The penalties upon a conviction of violating any of the provisions of this Chapter shall be a fine not exceeding \$250, except for corporations which shall be subject to a fine not

- exceeding \$500, and imprisonment for a term not to exceed fifteen (15) days, or both such fine and imprisonment.
- 3. The Town Board may also maintain a civil action or proceeding in the name of the Town in a court of competent jurisdiction to compel compliance with the terms and provisions of this Chapter, to restrain by injunction the violation of this Chapter and/or to seek civil damages for the violation of terms and provisions of this Chapter. Any person, corporation, limited liability company, partnership or other legal entity found to have violated any term or provision of this Chapter in a civil proceeding shall be subject to a civil fine not exceeding \$1,000 per occurrence.

Section 5: Chapter 146 (Solid Waste and Recycling) of the Code of the Town of South Bristol is hereby amended by adding a new section 146-10.1 to read as follows:

§ 146-10.1. Enforcement.

The Director or the Town of South Bristol Code Enforcement Officer is permitted to issue appearance tickets regarding violations of this Chapter and to take any other action necessary to prosecute a violation of this Chapter or otherwise enforce this Chapter.

Section 6: Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 7: Effective Date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

§19.6 County Board of Ethics

The Ontario County Board of Ethics shall render advisory opinions to officers and employees of the Town of South Bristol in accordance with the Code of Ethics herein and with respect to Article 18 of the New York State General Municipal Law, as amended. Such advisory opinions shall be rendered pursuant to the written request of an officer or employee of the Town under such rules and regulations as the Ontario County Board of Ethics may prescribe and shall have the advise of counsel employed by the Ontario County Board of Ethics, of if none, the County Attorney.

Section 3. Sections 19.8, 19.9 and 19.10 of Chapter 19 (Code of Ethics) of the Code of the Town of South Bristol are hereby renumbered to be 19.7, 19.8 and 19.9

Section 4: Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or

NEW BUSINESS MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT – ONTARIO COUNTY

Supr. Marshall noted that the agreement with the County extends an existing agreement but now have determined that we need to ask for a Certificate of Insurance from the County naming the Town. Councilwoman Welch agreed and said that Joel Steele's comment states that this agreement, an agreement for mutual aid and shared services arrangement with our Highway Dept. The section says "the Town shall be able to provide upon request updated insurance certificates to cover the extension period." Councilwoman Welch noted that they are mentioning certificates in plural because we cannot issue a 5-year certificate; our policy is only for a year. Councilwoman Welch continued, saying that Mr. Steele had thought the language wasn't that clear but was acceptable and indicated that it would not be an additional cost to the Town to add the County as an additional insured. Councilwoman Welch noted that Mr. Steele also indicated that the County should also add the Town as an additional insured; it is a mutual contract so both parties should have that. Councilwoman Welch said to send the contracts back to the County. Supr. Marshall said he would ask the DPW director to clarify.

Councilwoman Welch noted that the Town also works in the same capacity with other Towns and that Mr. Steele had said that we may want to consider being the additional insured with those we work with, villages and Towns. Supr. Marshall noted that the mutual aid between towns has been going on forever and will look into the history to see how it was handled. The

Town has never been asked for certificate of insurances from other towns and will ask the DPW commissioner. Councilwoman Welch agreed.

Supr. Marshall noted that no action was taken on.

CREATION OF LABORER - RECYCLING CENTER

Supr. Marshall noted that we have received the position classification from the County for the Laborer for the Transfer Station and received a letter back stating "we are enclosing a copy of the classification certification, No. 96-2012, which classifies the position of Laborer for the Town of South Bristol. It is now necessary for this position to be created by the Town Board."

On a motion made by Councilman Bachman to create a classification position for the Town of South Bristol and seconded by Councilman Storm was ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: Marshall, Welch, Arndt, Storm and Bachman.

OTHER BUSINESS TOWN CLERK'S REPORT

On a motion made by Councilwoman Welch to approve the Town Clerk's report for December 2012 and the Town Clerk's 2012 Annual Report and seconded by Councilman Arndt was ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: Marshall, Welch, Arndt, Storm and Bachman.

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

Supr. Marshall noted that there is not a Supervisor's Report tonight; the month and year need to be closed out. There will be 2 Supervisor's Reports next month.

OTHER BUSINESS

Supr. Marshall asked Clerk Hanley if there was any other business before the Board. Clerk Hanley noted that Mr. Wiltse wanted to have a moment of the Board's time.

Mr. Wiltse was glad to have a moratorium that is extended for 6 months, but thinks it is inevitable that NYS is going to get hydrofracking; economic factors being what they are. Mr. Wiltse doesn't want any hydrofracking in our Town and would rather not have it in the Finger Lakes. We do control what goes on in our town and has seen indications that Home Rule has been effective in other places to prevent it and is hoping that our esteemed Board is working on some sort of approach like that so when the moratorium expires and we are ready to hop on the Home Rule or something that prevents it coming to South Bristol.

Supr. Marshall said that the Planning Board is currently at work on the Moratorium project and they requested the 6 month extension. You may be interested in attending one of their meetings as well.

Mr. Wiltse asked if the Town Board is optimistic that the Planning Board will have something in place that will be acted on? Supr. Marshall said he is optimistic and explained that the Town Board is the ultimate Board and the Town Board appoints the Planning Board to work on these things for us. There is a Comprehensive Plan that was created that guides development of what goes; as an example the Comprehensive Plan states that the residents of the Town want to maintain its rural character. The function of hydrofracking would not be conducive to the Town's Comprehensive Plan. The retirement requirement is for the employee to track their hours for 3 months and the Board

Clerk Hanley noted that each time someone is re-elected who is enrolled in the NYS retirement program, a resolution needs to be passed by the Town Board for the Standard Work Day. The employee is required to submit a 90-day timesheet for hours worked.

On a motion made by Councilwoman Welch and seconded by Councilman Bachman Resolution No. 27-2013 was ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: Marshall, Welch, Arndt, Storm and Bachman.

RESOLUTION NO. 27-2013 STANDARD WORK DAY REPORTING RESOLUTION RS 2471-A

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of South Bristol hereby establishes the following as standard work days for elected and appointed officials and will report the following days worked to the New York State and Local Employee's Retirement System based on the time keeping system records or the record of activities maintained and submitted by these officials to the clerk of this body: Town Clerk, Judy Hanley, Term begins/ends: 1/1/12 – 12/31/15. Clerk Hanley asked if the fire contracts will be signed tonight? Supr. Marshall noted that we are obligated to pay the fire districts and can do so without a contract. Councilwoman Welch agreed and said that the additional named insured should be added to the contracts.

ACCOUNTING GENERAL FUND

Supr. Marshall noted that tonight's General Fund Abstract includes a Voucher No. 9 for the Honeoye Lake Watershed and would like to pull that voucher. Supr. Marshall noted that he did not budget for this because the Honeoye Lake Watershed did not submit anything during the budget process.

On a motion made by Councilman Bachman and seconded by Councilman Storm to pay the General Fund bills, Abstract #1, Voucher numbers 1-28, totaling \$58,771.04 except Voucher #9 to the Honeoye Lake Watershed for \$1,180.00 was ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: Marshall, Welch, Arndt, Storm and Bachman.

Councilman Arndt asked about Voucher #8 for Glenn Miller Safe & Lock for \$3,455.00. There was supposed to be supporting information. Clerk Hanley noted that the supporting information is attached to the Voucher. Supt. Wight noted that the automatic door closers are expensive; the door closer the Highway dept. installed at the Town Hall cost \$200.00.

HIGHWAY FUND

On a motion made by Councilwoman Welch and seconded by Councilman Storm to pay the Highway Fund bills, Abstract #1 Voucher numbers 1-15, totaling \$91,729.94 was ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: Marshall, Welch, Arndt, Storm and Bachman.

Supr. Marshall noted that the Highway Abstract includes payment for a lot of salt and fuel. Supt. Wight noted that during the week of Christmas and the storm, the Highway Dept. averaged 600 miles per truck.

FIRE DISTRICT ABSTRACT

On a motion made by Councilman Storm and seconded by Councilman Arndt to pay the 4 Fire District Abstracts for \$192,134.15 was ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: Marshall, Welch, Arndt, Storm and Bachman.

Supr. Marshall listed the Fire District expenses:

Naples Fire Dept. \$115,784.00 Richmond Fire Dept. \$22,869.00 Cheshire Fire Dept. \$49,325.15 Bristol Volunteer \$4,156.00

Supr. Marshall asked for anything else to come before the Town Board? Clerk Hanley noted that the Procurement Policy will need to be updated at the next Town Board meeting.

Councilman Arndt noted that last month he had a letter regarding the loan for Bristol Sewerage Corp. The issue is if there are surpurpolous funds in the fund that pays for fixing the sewer plant. Councilman Arndt is suggesting to use the money to go toward the loan. The reason Councilman Arndt is suggesting this is because of the findings that went into the motion to restructure that loan:

Finding #3: Restructuring the loan amounts to \$450k for the fixed portion at 5% with the balance going to the variable portion at 3.25% allows the flexibility of paying down the variable loan without penalty, as funds are available in the account through future tap-in fees and an increased user base.

Councilman Arndt continued, noting at that point and time the loan was paid down \$11,000.00. Now, there is \$20,000.00 in that same fund; more than they need to pay their annual bills and would like a motion to pay the \$20,000.00 towards the loan which will shorten the duration of the loan. This is all renegotiable in 5 years and the last review shortened the loan by 2 years and doesn't know the effect of this yet because future tap in fees, etc., going against the variable portion.

Supr. Marshall asked if the other option was putting the money into reserve? Councilman Arndt answered no that would be going against the findings that created the motion.

On a motion made by Councilman Arndt to take the \$20,000.00 in the fund be used against the variable portion of the loan obligation and seconded by Counilman Bachman was ACCEPTED. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: 5. Voting NAY: 0. Voting AYE: Marshall, Welch, Arndt, Storm and Bachman.

Councilman Arndt noted that he has not gotten the general accounting for the year from Bristol Harbor and will follow up on that. Councilman Bachman noted that he did speak with the office and understand their obligation.

Supt. Wight noted that MobilTech is working on updating and installing new radios at the Highway Dept. We may need to have to purchase one or two units.
